Matters Presented by the President – Dr. Susan A. Cole

Dr. Cole reported that the School of Communication and Media was formally opened on September 26^{th.,} during which President of Sony Electronics Katsunori Yamanouchi helped cut the ribbon. The building has been quite busy, hosting a round table with Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg and the Lieutenant Governor's debate between Assemblywoman Shiela Oliver and Mayor Carlos Rendo. The debate was broadcast by NJTV using the University's state of the art 4k technology. The renovation of Mallory continues on time and on budget. It will house the computer science department when it is completed. The University hosted Homecoming on October 14th. The Campus was filled with activity, hosting thousands of alumni, current students, and their families.

Reports - Student Government Association Presdient Yousef Al-Khudairi

President Al-Khudairi stated the Student Government Association (SGA) was quite busy with Homecoming preparations ensuring that as many students as possible partook in the programming. The SGA has donated \$5,000 to the Action Network to support DACA students, has hosted a hurricane relief fundraiser, and Al-Khudairi stated that SGA's goal was to make the campus as sustainable as possible.

Reports – University Senate President David Trubatch

Professor Trubatch thanked Dr. Cole for forwarding the issue of socially responsible investment to the University Senate for consultation, calling it an excellent example of shared governance. Professor Trubatch expressed how pleased he was that the University had received Public Research University status, and stated he looked forward to working with the University on the upcoming strategic plan.
