Dr. Cuss called the meeting to order via video conference at 11:45 am. Over 171members of the public attended the meeting by telephonic participations.

Statement regarding manner of public notice of meeting

Dr. Cuss read the following statement regarding the public notice of the meeting: "Please be advised that in compliance with the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting —June 3, 2020 — has been provided by distributing notices as required, properly posting 48-hour notice, and forwarding notices to designated newspapers and to persons requesting such notification."

Oath of Office – Ms. Faith Victor

University Counsel Mark Fleming administered the oath of office to student trustee, Faith Victor.

Minutes from the meeting of April 3, 2020

Trustees approved the minutes from April 3, 2020 as distributed.

Matters Presented by the Chair – Dr. Francis Cuss

Dr. Cuss reported that in closed session the Trustees reviewed the minutes from April 3, 2020, reviewed legal matters, discussed real estate matters, and heard updates regarding the Foundation and planning for the Fall semester. Dr. Cuss announced that the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees will meet weekly through the Summer to ensure that the Board is actively engaged and able to make decisions regarding University governance in a timely fashion. Dr. Cuss then made the following statement:

I would also like to this opportunity to mention how proud I am of our students. The University traditionally holds an in-person annual tuition hearing during which students have the opportunity to speak directly to the Board of Trustees in advance of the tuition, fees, and room and board rates for the upcoming year being determined. This year, in light of the coronavirus pandemic, the University provided an opportunity over several weeks for students to submit their testimony via email. We received over 130 student submissions, which represents a 10 fold increase in student participation over last year. The major themes in the letters,

which were both thoughtful and touching, are student concerns about their ability to pay and a desire for tuition not to be increased. All of the student submissions have been distributed to and reviewed by the Board. I want to assure the students that you have been heard.

Matters Presented by the President – Dr. Susan A. Cole

Dr. Cole welcomed new student trustee Faith Victor to the Board. Dr. Cole then highlighted several key appointments. Associate Vice President for Finance Donna McMonagle has been promoted to Vice President for Finance and Treasurer. Dr. Cole thanked Trustees Kennedy and Slutyer for their participation in the final candidate interviews. Dr. Wendy Lin-Cook joins the University as the first Vice President for Enrollment Management, and Dr. Kimberly Kilmer Hollister has been appointed as Dean of the Felicano School of Business. President Cole stated it was the University's intention to bring students back to campus for the Fall 2020 semester and enable the faculty to continue their important research. President Cole announced the establishment of the Covid-19 Planning Group headed by Dean of the School of Nursing Janice Smolowitz and Dean of the College of Science and Mathematics Lora Billings. The group will provide advice and recommendations to the President in regard to the University's safe reopening for both faculty and students. Dr. Cole acknowledged the social unrest seen across the country as a result of George Floyd's death and noted the important role that education plays in addressing the causes of social disparities.

Union Report

Professor Richard Wolfson spoke on behalf of AFT Local 1904. Professor Wolfson spoke of the tragic death of George Floyd and the social unrest that it prompted. He urged the entire university community to engage itself in the fight to end systemic racism. Professor Wolfson asked that the University extend a greater show of support for the employees during the uncertain times resulting from the global pandemic. He also urged the University to furlough managers in an equivalent manner as the unions are negotiating. Professor Wolfson requested that there be greater communications regarding the plans for the remainder of the Summer and the Fall 2020 semester.

Personnel, Compensation, Nominations and Governance Committee

Ms. Cali reported that the Personnel, Compensation, Nominations and Governance Committee reviewed the minutes from its June 3, 2020, meeting, proposed personnel actions and a list of new hires anticipated before the Board's next meeting.

BA IN LIBERAL STUDIES

Mr. LaRossa moved that the Montclair State University Board of Trustees approve the creation of a Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Liberal Studies, effective Spring 2021. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

School of Conservation

Mr. LaRossa moved that Board of Trustees hereby delegate authority to the President and University Counsel to take such actions as may be necessary, appropriate or required for the closure, cessation and/or suspension of education programs at the New Jersey School of Conservation, and to transfer and/or dispose of any interest the University may have in the New Jersey School of Conservation in any manner deemed appropriate, reasonable or as permitted by applicable law. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

Audit, Finance and Investment Committee

Mr. Kennedy reported that the Audit, Finance and Investment Committee reviewed the minutes from its meeting on April 3, 2020, reviewed contract awards, and discussed the financial impacts of the coronavirus pandemic and the University's response.

Mr. Kennedy moved that the Board of Trustees approve the following contract awards:

Reports

Student Representative

Student Representative Fathia Balgahoom stated her intention to continue to promote and increase student engagement, whether it be regarding social justice issues, political awareness, or matters within the University community. Ms. Balgahoom hopes to promote the role of the Student Representative so that the students she represents will have their voices heard and impact the manner in which the University is run.

University Senate President

Professor Trubatch addressed the extraordinary work of the front-line Faculty and Staff for their work bringing the University online this past semester during the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. He expressed

his hope that we have the opportunity to plan for the future challenges facing the University as a result of the pandemic. The concept of shared governance will be key as we create procedures and protocols that will impact all aspects of the University, especially the manner in which courses are delivered. The faculty has the expertise the University will need to answer these new and yet unknown challenges. Proffessor Trubatch noted this would be his last report to the Board and thanked them for their engagement and dedication to the University.
