Important Notes and Deadlines

Physiology and Hygiene Requirement - Deadline: By Clinical II Audit Deadline (see below)

The New Jersey Department of Education has a Physiology and Hygiene requirement for teaching certification candidates. This requirement can be satisfied by completing appropriate coursework or by passing the Health Knowledge Test available at the Center of Pedagogy. *Health and PE students satisfy this requirement with major coursework (HLTH 208 or HLTH 222). No further coursework or test is required.*

Substitute Teaching License Requirement - Deadline: Start as soon as admitted to TEP Date Completed:

Students are required to have a New Jersey Substitute Teaching License before starting the Professional Sequence. You are eligible to obtain a Substitute Teaching License once you have earned 30 credits. Students are advised to start this process as soon as possible as it can take up to three months to complete. Consult Canvas or Teacher Ed. Advisor for more information.

Clinical Practice I & II Application - Deadline: March 1st for Fall Clin. Pract. / Oct. 1st for Spring Clin. Pract. Date Completed: Students must complete the Clinical Practice I & II Application the semester before they plan to start Clinical I. The application is an online survey that informs the Office of Clinical Internships that you are ready to start your Clinical year and prompts them to initiate the placement process.

□ Clinical Practice I & II Audit - Deadline: July 15th for Fall Clinical Practice / December 15th for Spring Clinical Practice The Office of Teacher Education Advisement and Retention will conduct an audit to verify your eligibility once you submit your application for Clinical Practice. You can expect to receive formal notification from the Center of Pedagogy regarding your audit results.

Praxis Subject Assessment - Deadline: By Clinical II Practice Audit Deadline (see below)

The New Jersey Department of Education requires all candidates to achieve a minimum score on the Praxis Subject Assessment. Information regarding which test to register for and how to register is available on *www.ets.org/praxis*. Students are urged to take the required Praxis test as early as possible and report passing and non-passing scores to the Center of Pedagogy.
