# The Armenian Genocide, One Family's Story

Please join us for the opening reception of The Armenian Genocide, One Family's Story at the College for Engaged Learning at Montclair State University.

The exhibit, hosted in the ADP Center for Learning Technologies, traces the journey of Arek and Moses Zakarian from the turn of the twentieth century in the Ottoman Empire through genocide, survival, migration, and reemergence in the United States.

Visitors will engage with the family's personal photos, memoirs, musical instruments, artifacts and artwork—all of which serve as a backdrop to the broader history of the Armenian Genocide and related issues, including cultural loss and collective memory.

Importantly, the Zakarian story connects us to other survivor and refugee communities in New Jersey, highlighting our common humanity.
