Symphony No. 2 ("Genesis")

David R. Gillingham

The Montclair State University Wind Symphony premiered David Gillingham's *Symphony No.* 2 ("Genesis") in the fall of 2008. Dr. Thomas McCauley organized the commissioning of this piece through the creation of a consortium of 20 different universities and high school programs throughout the United States to celebrate Dr. Mallory Thompson's tenth year as Director of Bands at Northwestern University, to whom the piece is dedicated. Many of the consortium participants are former students or close friends of Dr. Thompson. It includes participants from New Jersey, Illinois, Indiana, Oregon, Kansas, Texas, Nevada, Massachusetts, California, Pennsylvania, Arkansas, and Ohio.

About the commissioning of Gillingham's *Symphony No. 2*, Dr. Thomas McCauley stated: "When I contacted David about writing a piece for Mallory, I was only thinking about perhaps a 8-9 minute work. When hearing that the piece was for Mallory, David said that he would like to take the commissioning opportunity to create his second symphony. We were obviously thrilled about the prospect of bringing this new piece into the universe for the first time."

Inspired by the Bible's book of *Genesis*, *Symphony No. 2* is a five movement, 25 minute work that, while certainly programmatic in nature, stands on its own when performed in separate movements.

Concert Suite for Alto Saxophone and Band

Commissioned by the University of Michigan Band Alumni Association, William Bolcom's *Concert Suite for Alto Saxophone and Band* was premiered by the University of Michigan Symphony Band and world - renowned soloist and teacher, Donald J. Sinta.

Our soloist, **Thomas Kurtz**, is the winner of the 2016-2017 MSU Wind Symphony Concerto Competition held each fall on the Montclair State University campus. Thomas is student of MSU saxophone professor, Stacy Wilson, and has been a valued member of the Montclair State University Wind Symphony for the past two years. He has performed with the Montclair State University Orchestra and the Baroque Orchestra of New Jersey. Most recently, he performed at the International U.S. Navy Band Saxophone Symposium, and received 3rd place in the 2017 MTNA Eastern Regional Competition.

Elsa's Procession to the Cathedral

Richard Wagner

Elsa's Procession to the Cathedral is a selection from the German romantic opera *Lohengrin* which premiered in 1850. The occasion for the procession is the imminent betrothal of heroine Elsa to Lohengrin, mystic Knight of the Holy Grail, come to deliver the people of Brabant (Antwerp) from Hungarian invaders. In the operatic presentation, a large double chorus adds its song of solemn praise to that of the orchestra. In this transcription for band the instrumental solo voices of the original are paralleled and the choral voices are deftly absorbed in the rich instrumental texture, recreating all the luxuriant Wagnerian color, drama, pageantry, power and mysticism of the original.

The Lucien Calliet transcription of Richard Wagner's beautiful *Elsa's Procession to the Cathedral* has become a treasured part of the wind band repertoire, and the MSU Wind Symphony is proud to close its concert today with this deliciously beautiful music.


r. Thomas McCauley is currently the Director of University Bands in the John J. Cali School of Music at Montclair State University in New Jersey where he conducts the Montclair State University Wind Symphony and Symphonic Band, and teaches both graduate and undergraduate conducting. He has held similar positions in the states of Indiana, Ohio, and Illinois in addition to teaching high school instrumental music in Nevada for nine years. In December of 2010, Dr. McCauley appeared as a clinician in Chicago at the 64th annual Midwest Clinic. Each November, he hosts and teaches a symposium at Montclair State University called the Weekend Wind Conducting Symposium with special guest clinicians and participants from around the world. Dr. McCauley is in demand as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator throughout North America.

Dr. McCauley has been published in *The Instrumentalist* magazine, several state music
magazines, and in the second edition of *Teaching*

Music Through Performance in Band, Vol I published by G.I.A. publications. In 1995, the Nevada Music Educator's Association named Dr. McCaulev Music Educator of the Year and in 2006, the Indiana Music Educators Association honored Dr. McCauley with an Outstanding University Music Educator Award. Dr, McCauley's book titled, Adventures in Band Building (or How to Turn a Less-Than-It-Could-Be into a More-Than-It-Should-Be) is published by G.I.A. Publications. He currently serves on the Executive Board of the New Jersey Band Association, the New Jersey State Representative of the College Band Directors National Association, and is the former New Jersey State Representative of the National Band Association. He is also an active member of the World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles, and the National Association for Music Education.
