



The American Pream is "[A] dream of Social order in which each man and woman shall be able to attain to the fullest stature of which they are innately capable."





Rationale For Essay 3

For essay three I chose to write about the character Leslie Knope from parks and recreation. I decided to do the multimodal revision as a comic.
